

- C. From a Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic background (as defined by [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk))
- D. Eligible to work and study in the UK and qualify under 'Home Fee' status
- E. Demonstrate a financial need (combined household income of less than £50k per year)
- F. Be in receipt of, or have previously received or have been eligible for, free school meals, pupil premium, education maintenance allowance and/or 16 to 19 bursaries
- G. This will be your first degree

Scholar Expectations: (including, but not limited to the following):

- Must be able to participate in all programme-related activities
- Remain in good academic standing
- Maintain no disciplinary infractions on academic record
- Students selected to participate in the programme must provide Windsor Fellowship with supporting documentation requested during the financial need verification process

The Programme

What is Windsor Fellowship's involvement/ role in the programme?

Visa is partnering with Windsor Fellowship to attract, source and shortlist the recipients of the Visa Scholarship Programme. They will also provide you with pastoral and interview support from the point of application.

Eligibility

Who is eligible to apply?

All of the following must apply to be eligible for consideration:

- A. Applied to study an undergraduate degree in a STEM related field (e.g., Computer Science, Information Science, Cybersecurity, Engineering or Maths) or Business (e.g., HR, Finance, Marketing, Sales, International Business, or related majors)
- B. Applied to UCAS to enrol on a full-time three or four undergraduate degree at any accredited university in the UK for 2021-22 entry.
- C. From a Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic background (as defined by [GOV.UK](#))
- D. Eligible to work and study in the UK and qualify under 'Home Fee' status
- E. Demonstrate a financial need (combined household income of less than £50k per year)
- F. Be in receipt of, or have previously received or have been eligible for, free school meals, pupil premium, education maintenance allowance and/or 16 to 19 bursaries
- G. This will be your first degree

Scholar Expectations: (including, but not limited to the following):

- Must be able to participate in all programme-related activities
- Remain in good academic standing
- Maintain no disciplinary infractions on academic record
- Students selected to participate in the programme must provide Windsor Fellowship with supporting documentation requested during the financial need verification process

Are the scholarships renewable?

If you continue to meet the criteria, remain in good standing and meet course requirements you will be eligible for annual renewals.

I am undecided on my area of study; can I still apply?

You must demonstrate interest in pursuing an education in a STEM related field (e.g., Computer Science, Information Science, Cybersecurity, Sciences, Engineering or Maths) or Business (e.g., HR, Finance, Marketing, Sales, International Business, or related majors)

Can I keep my scholarship if I switch course or transfer to another university?

Yes. The scholarship follows the selected scholars. You must continue to pursue a full-time undergraduate degree in any of the STEM or Business-related majors outlined above.

What does the selection process entail?

The selection process aims to assess all eligibility requirements and critical skills that will enable your success in the programme.

- **Stage 1** – Complete online application form
- **Stage 2** - Shortlisted applicants will be invited to take part in an online assessment
- **Stage 3** - Successful applicants will be invited to attend a virtual Assessment Centre with the Windsor Fellowship consisting of a presentation and interview.
- **Stage 4** – Final stage virtual interview with the Visa team
- **Stage 5** – Visa to select and inform successful Scholars.

I have a disability that means I would require adjustments to the recruitment process. What is the process for this?

To ensure a fair and unbiased recruitment process Visa and Windsor Fellowship will do our best to accommodate any reasonable requirements you may have due to your disability. Once you have made your application Windsor Fellowship will contact you about the next steps. At this point, please let them know about any adjustments you require.

Scholar Experience

If I am accepted, what will my experience look like?

- **Windsor Fellowship support** – Our partners the Windsor fellowship, will provide you with pastoral support throughout the programme.
- **Mentorship** – You'll receive coaching, mentorship and guidance from experienced Visa employees.
- **Skills building** – You'll have the chance to grow key technical, professional and leadership skills through training and development opportunities.
- **Career development** – You'll have exposure to career growth activities to help prepare for post-graduation careers.
- **Work Experience** – During the summer there will be options to get work experience and engage with Visa, including the opportunity to apply for a paid internship where you can learn new skills, collaborate and find a community of like minded students.

Is the internship paid, and if so, how much?

Yes, the summer internship is paid. The amount is based on your internship location and will be shared with the student when an offer is made.
